## GIFTS FOR DADAA'S FUTURE

Gifting to DADAA's Future will help DADAA WA create a legacy for the future of people with disabilities and people experiencing disadvantage.

Donations or gifts of stock and property can be received by DADAA's Future. These gifts will form a capital base which will be invested to generate interest to be used to fund local WA projects.

Alternatively, leaving a bequest is a simple way you can contribute to the disabled and disadvantaged community. If this is something you or your family might like to do, the DADAA WA Advisory Committee can provide you with some appropriate wording or you can contact WACF.

Donations will be used to fund DADAA WA projects, which might include:

**Proper Shoes** project which provides writing and performance based projects for young women aged 14-24 experiencing disabilities.

**Be Active - Artlink** program providing young people with disabilities access to 45 weeks of arts and cultural programs.

**The Freight Gallery** project offers people with persistent mental illness a 2 year program to develop skills in the visual arts.

**Home & Community Care** - is designed to help people who are aging with disability to live independently.

**Northern Exposure** providing health and disability awareness in remote Indigenous communities.

## SNAP SHOT - DADAA WA 2005

DADAA WA's main market is people with disabilities between the ages of 4 to 90 years, servicing approximately 1,800 Western Australians directly every year through art workshops and projects.

DADAA WA provides a respite service for families and carers of people with disabilities, and provides arts for the disability sector.

- Across Western Australia, DADAA WA is working within 46 communities including 14 regional communities.
- DADAA WA's Ageing and Disability Program is expanding in response to the growing population of elderly people with disabilities.
- During 2005, DADAA WA has conducted in excess of 61 individual projects across WA including regional Indigenous communities.
- DADAA WA is the largest Arts & Disability organisation in Australia, and is the only Arts & Disability organisation offering a truly state wide service.



### WHY WORK WITH WACF?

The cost and time required to establish and run our own foundation is high and each year DADAA WA could be faced with spending its donations on administration and marketing.

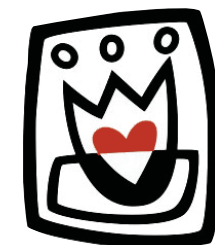
Working in partnership with WACF will see our community benefit from:
